GREEK THEATRE GLOSSARY and CHORUS WORK

DIONYSIS/BACCHUS

The god of theatre, wine, changing seasons and fertility.

Also called **City Dionysia**, ancient dramatic festival in which tragedy, comedy, and satyric drama originated

GREAT DIONYSIA

AMPHITHEATRES

Outdoor performance space where Greek Theatre was performed, tiered seating in a semi-circle

ACOUSTICS

How sounds resonate in a performance space

CHORUS

A group of people who help to communicate the story to an audience.

CHORAL SPEAKING TECHNIQUES – voice effects

UNISON	A group speaking 'as one voice' together.
ЕСНО	A sound that is repeated and gradually becomes quieter.
CANNON	A sound that is made by a number of people one after another.
WHISPER	Speech that is spoken softy in a low volume.
REPETITION	When a particular word or phrase is spoken more than once for emphasis.
CHANTING	A section of text that is spoken in a strong rhythm.
SINGING	Tone and rhythm of the musical sounds of the voice.
EMPHASIS / ACCENTS	When a particular word is stressed to highlight its importance.
CRESCENDO	Getting louder

Getting softer

CHORAL MOVEMENT TECHNIQUES

A group using the same action, movement or gesture at the same

time.

When a movement happens more than once to highlight its

importance.

When a group of people all complete the same action, movement or gesture one after

another...

When the chorus marches on the

spot.

When the chorus uses dance movement to communicate the story to an audience..

When action is played backwards or forwards quickly – can be used to skip sections or to go back to particularly important sections.

When the movement is performed significantly slower than it would be in reality. This helps the
